Amery's Talking Points on The Stower

1. This Resolution is deficient.
2. As agreed to with Polk County, and as required under Natural Resources Rule 44, plans for State Trails must incorporate and acknowledge existing plans of other governmental entities involved in the planning process and who have jurisdiction over parts of the State Trail. (See NR 44 subsection .04)
3. Starting in 2017, Amery spent a full year developing a Municipal Bike and Pedestrian Plan. That plan has been submitted to and approved by the Amery City Council on July 25th, 2018.
4. As part of that plan, Amery has received grant monies from the Amery Hospital Foundation to implement the Plan which utilizes the Stower Seven Lakes Trail and the Cattail State trail, and which requires paving a small portion of the trails.
5. Amery has provided this Municipal Bike and Pedestrian Trail Plan to Polk County on multiple occasions, as recently as 2018, and to which then Corporate Counsel Jeff Fuge signed a letter, along with Mayor Isakson, to urge the WDNR to incorporate Amery's plan into the new Stower Trail Master plan.
6. There is no mention, nor incorporation of the Amery Municipal Bike and Pedestrian Plan in the current Polk County Resolution nor any of its Draft Master Plan documents.
7. As such, and given that Amery has jurisdiction over the Stower Seven Lakes Trail within its corporate city limits, I request that Polk County work with Amery to incorporate our Bike and Pedestrian Plan with the Draft Amendment to the Stower Seven Lakes Trail Master Plan.
8. I request that Polk County work with Amery, its City Council and staff to resolve these issues as soon as possible before moving on to submitting its Draft Amendment to the Stower Seven Lakes Trail Master Plan.
9. Amery has also applied for and received a Safe Routes to School Grant that will be incorporating a major portion of the Amery Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan for safe routes to our schools.
