

2016 ELECTION INFORMATION

August 9th, 2016 is the Partisan Primary Election for the office of US Senator, Representative in Congress District 7, State Senator District 10, Representative to Assembly District 28, District Attorney, County Clerk, County Treasurer, and County Register of Deeds. Winners of these contest will advance to the General Election on Tuesday, November 8th, 2016. You must be registered to vote. If you are not registered in the City of Amery, have moved or changed your name since you last voted you will need to fill out a form to update your voter registration. Please bring with you proof of residence such as your driver's license, State ID, utility bill, real estate tax bill or receipt, residential lease, bank statement, DNR license, or pay stub.

You also must show a photo ID when voting. This may be a driver's license, State ID, US passport, US military ID, or Wisconsin UW or VTAE system student photo ID. If you would like to vote by absentee ballot you must make a request in writing. Please contact City Clerk Fran Duncanson at 715-268-7486 with absentee ballot or other election questions.

Located right in the heart of Amery along the beautiful Apple River, the North Park RV Campground offers 8 RV sites with 50-AMP service and water hook-ups as well as fire ring. Additionally, the park contains: free Wi-Fi, dump station, playground, canoe/kayak launch, fishing pier, and basketball, tennis and frisbee golf.

Open June until November 1, campsites are first come, first serve. RV sites are \$25 per night with a maximum stay of 7 days. Leashed pets are welcome. Alcohol is not permitted on the campground.

Your Amery Area Public Library/MORE card gives you access to both the Wisconsin Digital Library collection of e-books, e-audiobooks and streaming video, and the Freading collection of e-books. The Wisconsin Digital Library (wplc.dbooks.info) partners with Overdrive to offer over 42,000 e-book, 13,000 e-audiobooks, and 400 streaming video titles. The Wisconsin Digital Library also features "eReading Rooms" geared towards kids and teens. The Freading collection provides thousands of e-book titles, with a stronger emphasis on non-fiction. Titles in both of these collections can be accessed from a computer or from a mobile device (smart phone, tablet or dedicated e-reader).
